Is Pitcairn a dark sky sanctuary?

After Hearnshaw's trip in early 2018, his findings were sent to the International Dark-Sky Association in Arizona, and on April 4, 2019, Pitcairn officially became the eighth location in the world to earn the status of Dark Sky Sanctuary (others include the Rainbow Bridge National Monument in Utah and Gabriela Mistral in Chile's Elqui Valley).

History meets adventure on one of the world's most isolated and remote destinations - the Pitcairn Islands. And when we say remote, we mean it: no airport, a population of just 50 residents, and home to the world's smallest capital.

Why is Pitcairn a unique place?

Shortly after they made it ashore, the *Bounty* was set alight by one of the mutineers, turning Pitcairn into a prison island for the settlers. For better and worse, today it is a singular place, not just unique, but actively unlike anywhere else on Earth.

Is Pitcairn Island dead?

Pitcairn Island lay dead ahead, but only when the sun rose into a more benign position could we discern its ragged profile. "The perfect island on which to seek refuge," said one of the guides on the *Aranui 5*, a combined freight and passenger ship that connects Polynesian islands.

How to get to Pitcairn Islands?

Totegegie Airport in Mangareva can be reached by air from the French Polynesian capital Papeete. There is one 6.4-kilometre (4 mi) paved road leading up from Bounty Bay through Adamstown. The main modes of transport on Pitcairn Islands are by four-wheel drive quad bikes and on foot.

In 1916, during World War I, French and British troops invaded the German colony of Kamerun and divided it between themselves to administer. British rule marked a period of neglect, as they were more concerned with other areas of Africa and an influx of Nigerian settlers caused resentment in Cameroon.
