

Does reflect Orbital have a solar farm?

Last summer, Reflect Orbital tested its mirror on a hot air balloon floating 1.7 miles (3 km) above a solar farm. The company was able to generate “500 watts of energy per square meter” (11 square feet) of solar panel, which is about “half the brightness of the sun,” according to Nowack.
