

Why is thermal energy storage important?

Thermal energy storage (TES) is increasingly important due to the demand-supply challenge caused by the intermittency of renewable energy and waste heat dissipation to the environment. This paper discusses the fundamentals and novel applications of TES materials and identifies appropriate TES materials for particular applications.

Energy storage has become an important part in renewable energy technology systems such as solar systems. TES is a technology that stocks thermal energy by heating or cooling a storage medium so that the stored energy can be used at a later time for heating and cooling applications and power generation.

How does a thermal energy storage system work?

**Energy Collection:** Thermal energy is captured from a heat source. This heat might come from natural sources like solar heat (captured using solar thermal panels), industrial waste heat, or even off-peak electricity converted to heat via an electric heater. **Energy Storage:** The captured heat is transferred to a TES medium.
